

## Re-Member to Recruit & Retain PDP Kathy Keizer – Department 1st Vice President

### THE NEXT DEADLINE DATE FOR MEMBERSHIP IS: Renewed annual members POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN 1/5 (paid by 12/31)

Any annual renewals not submitted by January 5 will have to pay the new member amount of \$30 and they will be considered a "rejoin". Members who have not renewed their membership can NO LONGER be included in the total membership of your Auxiliary on January 1. Any officer who has not paid her dues cannot continue to hold an office after January 1 and must be replaced.

The D&R's which are coming in have several mistakes even by ladies who have done this job for more than one year!! PLEASE REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING:

- The letters "RL" ARE NOT for sending in the Life member assessment! This term means "Renew to Life" which means a current annual member has decided to become a Life member. We do not renew Life members – they are members for LIFE!!
- After January 1 an annual member can't purchase a Life membership UNTIL next September 1.
   They have to be sent to National by our deadline so it must be on a D&R postmarked December 5.
   Only NEW Life members are accepted year around!
- Honorary member's dues have been raised to \$15 by National.
- List the names ALPHABETICALLY BY LAST NAME.
- List the names in a group by the type of membership they have Renew, Rejoin, New, New Life, Renew to Life, Honorary and New Honorary – again ALPHABETICALLY BY LAST NAME.
- Don't forget to include the needed forms for New Honorary, Renew to Life and New Life members!!!
- Don't forget to fill in your check correctly. Renewals are \$25, new members and those who don't pay by December 31 when their card expires are \$30, Life member assessment is \$3, a New Life and Renew to Life are \$278.

If you have ANY questions about membership, the dues amount, filling out your D&R, please contact me first. If you have questions about if your D&R was received or a mistake on your D&R, you should call Nancy since she receives them before I do.
