#### However, the Department does have room for improvement:

- The environment is too stuffy & formal relax more;
- Less "bickering" and more respect for attendees;
- More question-and-answer sessions; classes with individual officers
- Classes are repeated too often. Break-out sessions with an opportunity for attendees to select which to attend
  would be better. New trainers and new information-sharing;
- All ladies representing Department need to arrive and be ready to start meetings at the scheduled time;
- Newer/1\*time attendees aren't always made to feel welcomed;
- Too expensive and/or too far away to drive;
- Find away to get more members to attend;
- Would like Department Officers to be more available and/or responsive to local questions;
- Smaller Auxiliaries feel as if they don't have as much input or are not listened to as are larger Auxiliaries.
- Zoom meetings or web-based meetings/training would reach more members.

#### Other:

- Most respondents see the monthly newsletter but would like more informative articles from the Dept. Officers.
- Service reports are being completed but suggest the Department Officers reach out to those who do not complete them to find out why.
- Localized and/or web-based training would be appreciated. Templates for developing websites and social media pages;
- Automate reporting, automate membership ask National to help bring Auxiliary into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.
